Where to Place the Bunker Rakes?

There have been a number of comments about where to place the bunker rakes so they won't affect play. The Green Committee has addressed this issue and decided to make a change. In the past the committee has adopted the USGA recommendation to place the rakes outside the bunkers. Some members felt that was a problem when a ball would strike the rake and go in the bunker or interfere with an otherwise good shot. The Green Committee discussed the option of placing the rakes at the bunker edge to avoid affecting a good shot and for easy access for the players. This wasn't a practical solution since the rake could prevent the ball from rolling to the bottom of the bunker and leave the golfer with a more difficult shot. One that might leave them to deal with the bunker edge and/or the slope.

A third option was discussed to place the rakes in the bottom of the bunkers. This would be helpful to the maintenance crew and would be the best option to keep the bunker rakes out of play but will require players to enter the bunker to retrieve the rake, rake their tracks and throw the rake back to the center of the bunker after their shot. While it is not a perfect solution the Green Committee has decided to adopt a new policy to have all bunker rakes placed in the bottom of the bunkers.

The Green Committee would like to encourage everyone to follow the recommendation and thank you all for your cooperation with the new policy and place the rakes in the bottom of the bunkers.

The Green Committee meets the second Thursday of every month at 1 pm in the Magnolia Room. We encourage you to attend if you have any questions or comments about the golf course.

She commented "the guests of Chili's usually didn't frequent the same restaurant daily but Country Club Members are often in the restaurant several times a week and generally have higher expectations".

Why did I find her approach a little different from what we have experienced at the Country Club before? Amanda pointed out that the tone is set by her boss, Lynn Jensen and the directive is simple - "improve Canyon Lake Property Values". She pointed out that the Country Club restaurant is accessible to the public and is often the first impression of our Community to the General Public. Raising the caliber and setting the bar as high as possible has been embraced by her key team members Chef Alex Arteaga, Manager Assistants Amy Homick and Cortland Karlesky and Banquet Manager Christina Barton. She noted "It's all about being aware and coaching to get expectations accomplished, communicating with employees and never interrogating". Rule 5 Playing the Round

Rule 5.2 Practicing on Course Before or Between Rounds

For purposes of this rule:

- Practicing on the course means playing a ball, or testing the surface on the putting green of any hole by rolling or rubbing the surface, and
- the limitations on practice on the course before or between rounds apply only to the player, not to the player's caddie.

5.2a Match Play

A player may practice on the course before a round or between rounds of a match-play competition.

5.2b Stroke Play

On the day of a stroke-play competition:

A player must not practice on the course before a round, except that the player may practice putting or chipping on or near his or her first teeing area and practice on any practice area. A player may practice on the course after completing play of his or her final round for that day.

Rule 5.2b Interpretations:

5.2b/I - Meaning of Completing Play of His or Her Final Round for That Day in Stroke Play In stroke play, a player has completed his or her final round for that day when he or she will not play any more holes that day on the course as part of the competition.

 For example, having completed play in the first round of the first day of a two-day 36 hole stroke play competition, a player is permitted by Rule 5.2b to practice on the competition course later that day as long as his or her next round will not start until the next day.

5.2b/3 Practicing May Be Allowed on Course Before a Round in a Competition that Covers Consecutive Days

When a competition is scheduled on a course over consecutive days and the Committee schedules some players to play on the first day and others to play on a later day, a player is allowed to practice on the course on any day that he or she is not scheduled to play his or her round.

Rule 12 Bunkers

Rule 12.2a Removing Loose Impediments and Movable Obstructions

- Before playing a ball in a bunker, a player may remove loose impediments under Rule 15.1 and movable obstructions under Rule 15.2.
- This includes any reasonable touching or movement of the sand in the bunker that happens while doing so.

Rule12.2a Interpretations:

12.2a/I - Improvement Resulting from Removing Loose Impediment or Movable Obstruction from a Bunker

When removing a loose impediment or a movable obstruction from a bunker, sand is often moved as a result of removing the object, and there is no penalty if this improves the condition affecting the stroke if the actions taken to remove the loose impediment or movable obstruction were reasonable (Rule 8.lb(2)).

For example, a player removes a pine cone near his or her ball and improves the conditions affecting the stroke by dragging the pine cone away in a way that also removes a mound of sand from the area of his or her intended swing.

The player could have used a less intrusive way to remove the pine cone (such as lifting the pine cone straight up without dragging it behind the ball). Because his or her actions are not reasonable in this situation, the player gets a penalty (2 Strokes) for breach of Rule 8.la (Improving the Conditions Affecting the Stroke).

5 Things You Need to Know about the World Handicap System

1. Your Handicap Index may change.

But that's okay! Finally, players around the world will have an apples-to-apples handicap. Your new Handicap Index will be more responsive to good scores by averaging your <u>eight best scores</u> out of your most recent 20 (currently, it's 10 out of 20 with a .96 multiplier). In short, your Handicap Index will be determined by your demonstrated ability and consistency of scores. In most cases for golfers in the U.S., it will change less than one stroke.

2. You need to know your Course Handicap.

In the new system, your <u>Course Handicap</u> will be the number of strokes needed to play to par. This will result in greater variance in that number and presents a change, as historically it has represented the number of strokes needed to play to the <u>Course Rating</u>. This is a good thing, as par is an easy number to remember. Target score for the day? Par plus Course Handicap. The Course Rating will now be inherent within the <u>calculation</u> to be more intuitive and account for competing from different tees.

3. Net Double Bogev.

The maximum hole score for each player will be limited to a <u>Net Double Bogey</u>. This adjustment is more consistent from hole to hole than the Equitable Stroke Control procedure. Net Double Bogey is already used in many other parts of the world and the calculation is simple: Par + 2 + any handicap strokes you receive.

4. Your Handicap Index will be revised daily.

One way that handicapping is being modernized is a player's Handicap Index will <u>update daily</u> (which will provide a fairer indication of a player's ability in the moment), if the player submitted a score the day before. On days where the player does not submit a score, no update will take place.

5. Safeguards in the new system.

The new system will <u>limit extreme upward movement</u> of a Handicap Index, automatically and immediately reduce a Handicap Index when an <u>exceptional score</u> of at least 7 strokes better is posted, and account for <u>abnormal course</u> or <u>weather conditions</u> to ensure that scores reflect when a course plays significantly different than its established Course Rating and Slope Rating.
