

Wet Bunkers:

Drains in the bunkers have become clogged and the water from rain and irrigation drain slowly creating puddles and wet sand. The sand becomes quickly contaminated. If the bunker drains slowly, the water is bringing fines to the surface of the sand making the material more dense as water struggles to get through. Also, the sand breaks down because of foot traffic, raking and general bunker maintenance and causes a very fine silt. Overspray from irrigation mixes with the silt and creates a hardening effect. Additionally, dirt from the bunker floor becomes mixed with the sand along with golf course debris that blows into the bunker. When a bunker gets washed out it also brings foreign dirt into the bunker. Contaminated sand clogs bunker drains even more. This Winter's extreme rainy weather is also a contributing factor to the contamination. According to several golf associations (like the USGA Green Section), the life cycle of a bunker is 5-7 years. Currently our bunkers are approaching 8 years old since they were last re-worked, so it's not surprising we are experiencing drainage problems. However, the warmer summer weather should help dry the bunkers out in the coming weeks.

Other notes:

Please ride two to a cart to decrease the amount of carts out there that cause compaction of our turf and please keep carts away from the greens and collars!

All, as members we need to not only protect and take care of our course by watching the outside players but we also have to obey rules ourselves. There's been several instances that I've seen members driving on the par 3's. If you're not handicapped stay on the cart paths!!

Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award.

Example:

Starting Handicap Index: $24.3 \mid$ Ending Handicap Index: 16.2 Value A: $24.3 + 12 = 36.3 \mid$ Value B: 16.2 + 12 = 28.2

A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128 Improvement factor: 1.128

Info from the August 1983 Bulletin – 40 years ago!

The Men's Golf Club Championship was held in August 1983. **Bert Nafziger** was not only defending his Club Championship, he was seeking his ninth championship trophy since 1973. (He did win in 1983 – the last of his nine club championships)

The "Greenskeeper" (Golf Course Superintendent) reported that they are mowing the greens six times per week, every day but Tuesday (I'll bet that thrilled the ladies), the tees on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday and the fairways on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. He further reported that "the golf course is watered the best we can". The golf course had a manual irrigation system, except for the greens and during the hot summer months it was necessary to water during playing hours to cover the entire course. My how things have changed.

The Bulletin reported that Junior Golf Week, held in July, was a great success with 40 participants. We had 160 participants in Junior Golf Week this last week in July 2023, with a waiting list of 30. As I said in the previous paragraph "My how things have changed". Then and now, this is a popular event and a great service to the youth of Canyon Lake, organized and put on by Pat Kemball and his pro shop staff and volunteers.

The last from the August 1983 bulletin: "Yearly dues are due August 1st.... Make check payable to the ...POA. \$570/Couple, \$365/Individual". Again, "My how things have changed".

20 years ago - the August 2003 Bulletin!

Many of you may now start to remember some of the happenings of August 2003. *Terry Miles* was President of the CLMGC. Current CLMGC member *Fred Hemborg* (grandfather of Hailee in the pro shop) was the membership director and reported that the club had 479 members. Again, "My how things have changed".

The TWG reported that major projects they completed during the work year ending June 30 were the turnout on the #4 tee box, widening of the cart path behind the #9 green, and the railing down the cart path on hole #17.

The Superintendent of Golf reported that "we are now in the summer transition where we are trying to stimulate Bermuda grass and letting the Rye die out". Some things never change!

The Bulletin reported that *Carlos Ramirez* had his third "hole in one" on hole #2, using a 9 wood. The shot was witnessed by current CLMGC member Steve McCain. *Marcus Schonabaum* had his third "hole in one" on #8 using a 7 iron. Current members Bob Stinson and Ron Bemoll witnessed the shot. I thought Ron Bemoll worked. How was he off on Wednesday?

A bit of trivia: Bert Nafziger won the Club Championship nine times as reported above. Brandon Mojarro has also won the Club Championship nine times and Marcus Schonabaum is slightly behind with seven championships.

Green Committee Notes

Please be respectful of homeowners on the golf course. Please know that when selecting a line for a particular shot there might be someone's property or person at risk of getting hit by a golf ball. Children may out playing in backyards as well as front yards. Balls coming to rest in someone's property are out of play and may not be retrieved.

Please use golf cart turnouts around the greens and try not to park on the grass. Other carts can then easily get by-and not travel on the grass.

Soft green conditions mean more ball marks. The proper technique for ball mark repair is easy and fast:

Insert the ball mark repair tool behind the ball mark and gently push the top of the tool toward the center. Continue working around the ball mark, pushing the surrounding turf in toward the center of the indentation. Avoid using a lifting or twisting motion because this can damage turf roots. Once you have finished pushing turf in toward the center, gently tamp the area down with your putter to create a smooth, firm surface.


