

As Hannah Bagnell and Breanna Noble took their victory walk up to the podium to receive their 2023 Women's Four-Ball Championship trophies, the remaining 188 players in the field couldn't help but rise to their feet and incite a roaring round of applause. It was a fitting end to a historical event as Hannah and Breanna, each 14 years old, worked together to shoot seven-under over 36 holes at Desert Willow Golf Resort to become the youngest winners ever in Four-Ball Championship history.

It was evident the SCGA Junior members were firing on all cylinders from the jump, as they logged the championship's lowest round on Monday, four-under 68, to share the clubhouse lead with AiLam Newkirk and 2022 SCGA Senior Women's Player of the Year, Shelly Haywood.

The two teams were paired together on the final day, and the teenagers did not flinch, going shot for shot against the decorated amateurs. Bagnell/Noble broke through and established a solo lead on their third hole of the day, when Noble chipped in for eagle from the fringe of the par-5 18th hole. Newkirk/Haywood bogeyed, so the three-shot swing gave Bagnell and Noble enough cushion to hold the advantage and eventually capture the crystal.

## From the Green Committee:

Maintenance Monday June 12, Brightveiw will be spaying the fairways to kill the winter rye grass that was planted during the Winter over-seeding. The rye grass eradication will give the Bermuda grass a better chance to flourish and spread during the hot summer months. The growth of the Bermuda grass is crucial to keep our fairways thick and playable for the Summer months and when transitioning into Winter. This process will cause some thin spots in the fairways that should fill in as the weather gets hotter. Bermuda grass typically needs one hundred days of one hundred degree temperatures to flourish. The roughs will not be sprayed, so the winter rye will slowly die out as the weather gets hotter. The underlying Bermuda grass should fill in as this happens. This is a yearly ongoing process to keep our golf course beautiful and playable throughout the year.



## CLAPPS Raise Over \$12,000 in Beautification Tournament

On Saturday April 29, the golf community rallied together in support of the annual CLAPPS Beautification Tournament. The CLAPPS (Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents) is a group of Men's Golf Club Presidents who continue to serve the golf community with their annual fundraiser that has raised over \$100,000 over the past 15 years. 100% of the proceeds of the tournament are spent on improvements on the golf course. Recent projects include 11' tall Street Clock on the putting green, 13 concrete benches, Concrete lighthouse logo and landscaping behind #17 green, new sand containers and bronze tee signs on each tee box to identify the hole number and the yardages.

Not all this would be possible without the support of the golf community including the local businesses and members who generously donated to the event. Major Sponsors of the tournament were the Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club, Canyon Lake Women's Golf Club, Coldwell Banker Realty – Margaret McCoy, BrightView Golf Course Services, PBK Golf Services – Pat Kemball, PGA, Canyon Lake Gunsmithing, National Dent, Platinum Plumbing, PMC Inc., Prestige Golf Cars and Warren Packaging. An additional 34 local businesses, clubs and individuals contributed in support of the tournament. In addition to the cash donors there were many local merchants that offered services and merchandise for the Raffle and the Auction that raised over \$2800.




