Instructions for determining the Most Improved Golfer

Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award.

Example:

Starting Handicap Index: $24.3 \mid$ Ending Handicap Index: $16.2 \cdot$ Value A: $24.3 + 12 = 36.3 \mid$ Value B: $16.2 + 12 = 28.2 \cdot$

A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128 Improvement factor: 1.128


Wet Bunkers:

Drains in the bunkers have become clogged and the water from rain and irrigation drain slowly creating puddles and wet sand. The sand becomes quickly contaminated. If the bunker drains slowly, the water is bringing fines to the surface of the sand making the material more dense as water struggles to get through. Also, the sand breaks down because of foot traffic, raking and general bunker maintenance and causes a very fine silt. Overspray from irrigation mixes with the silt and creates a hardening effect. Additionally, dirt from the bunker floor becomes mixed with the sand along with golf course debris that blows into the bunker. When a bunker gets washed out it also brings foreign dirt into the bunker. Contaminated sand clogs bunker drains even more. This Winter's extreme rainy weather is also a contributing factor to the contamination. According to several golf associations (like the USGA Green Section), the life cycle of a bunker is 5-7 years. Currently our bunkers are approaching 8 years old since they were last re-worked, so it's not surprising we are experiencing drainage problems. However, the warmer summer weather should help dry the bunkers out in the coming weeks.

Other notes:

Please ride two to a cart to decrease the amount of carts out there that cause compaction of our turf and please keep carts away from the greens and collars!

All, as members we need to not only protect and take care of our course by watching the outside players but we also have to obey rules ourselves. There's been several instances that I've seen members driving on the par 3's. If you're not handicapped stay on the cart paths!!



What a crazy day. The finals of our President Cup and VP Cup were held this morning. The beauty of match play is that you only need to beat your opponent - and some days - when your not playing your best - you can eke out a win.

Maybe it was the heat, or the winds, or the 20-40 people in the gallery - either way the pressure was on today for the players battling it out.

First off before I get into the results - I want to thank everyone who came out. It was great to see so many people out there today to support our players. As you can tell by the scores - these guys were not at the top of their game. Kumo was running on fumes - as he pulled an all nighter on his job and Campbell was able to take advantage. **Congrats to David Campbell! Our 2023 President Cup Champion.**

From your Historian ~ Septembers Past:

September 11, 2001 ~ "We will never forget"!

September is the month when many "Stag Day" tournaments have been held, the first one, 41 years ago in 1982. Up until the 2000's, the tournament was known as the annual "Golf Cart Stag Day" tournament. First prize was a golf cart for many, many years, when you could still buy a golf cart for \$5,000 or less. Other prizes were golf merchandise with the Men's Golf Club Bulletin of 40 years ago stating "...revenue from the tournament was spent on improvements to the golf course, not big cash prizes to opportunity drawing winners". Conversion to cash winners started around 2010 as the price of golf carts outpaced tournament revenue. The 1983 tournament had an entry fee of \$50, including green fee, dinner and drawing ticket. Drawing ticket only was \$25.

September, 40 years ago ~ Bert Nafziger won his ninth and final Club Championship. Brandon Mojarro is tied with Bert at nine championships. *Better get going Brandon!* I know there's support for you to take the lead, because I've seen signs in Canyon Lake that read "Let's go Brandon". The POA signed a 20-year contact with the EVMWD to provide non-potable water to 15 of the 18 holes on the golf course at a cost of one-fifth the cost of potable water, \$50/acre foot versus \$250/acre foot, a savings of a minimum of \$30,000 per year.

September, **30 years ago** ~ The year was 1993 and the Men's Golf Club was preparing for the 21st annual "Golf Cart Stag Day". The minutes of the August Men's Golf Club Board Meeting report that a presentation was made by the Canyon Lake Tennis Club seeking support to purchase land west of the current #17 green for \$15,000/acre to build two golf holes and housing and convert current holes 10 and 11 to build tennis courts that could also utilize the Country Club restaurant and clubhouse. The minutes further state "No apparent support was afforded … the presentation". "The Californian" newspaper (now the *Press Enterprise*) ran an article that "Canyon Lake Country Club appears to be a low-score paradise for golfers". Then it went on to say "But upon further inspection, uphill, downhill and sideway lies make the course more imposing and definitely more challenging". Things haven't changed much through the years!

September, 20 years ago ~ Terry Miles was President of the Men's Golf Club with a membership of 482. Zelda Dunn was President of the Women's Golf Club with a membership of 204. Terry's big push in his president's report was support of "**Stag Day**" and Zelda thanked all of those that participated in the "**Rally for a Cure**" tournament that netted \$1,645 for the benefit of breast cancer research. The bulletin also reports that Dick Messer won the President's Cup with a 20-hole play-off victory over Travis Montgomery. (**Those were the days**)! Golf pro Dave Lindeman reported that 304 junior golfers participated in the junior golf tournament.

Marcus Schonabaum set a new course record in August of 63. Marcus is still going strong! The "*After Lunch Bunch*" was going strong and still is. Current players at Canyon Lake Bullwhose names were mentioned often as weekly winners 20-years ago include Joe Washle, Dennis Franks, Kevin O'Leary, Ed Doidge and Don Raworth. These guys are like "Die Hard" batteries, they just keep going.


